MONTHLY REPORT—March 2025

Dear Brethren in Christ,

Greetings in the name of our Lord! We pray this newsletter finds you well and thriving in all your endeavors as we conclude the first quarter of the year.

It was a joy and a blessing to attend the Gospel Meeting at the Schertz Church of Christ in Schertz, Texas, on March 16. The four-day meeting, led by Brother John Grubb, centered on the theme “Growing in Christ.” Brother John has been preaching since 1970 and served as a missionary in Taiwan for ten years. Through his diligent efforts to learn Chinese, he became fluent in Mandarin—speaking, reading, and writing with ease.

During his mission work in Taiwan, my wife Yolanda—then still single—was baptized as a result of Brother John's evangelistic efforts. It was truly heartwarming for both of us to reunite with him in Texas. May God continue to bless him richly in his ongoing work in Indonesia, Malaysia, and Singapore.

Looking ahead, our video lessons on the book of *Galatians* are scheduled to be recorded during the first week of April. By the time you read this newsletter, all thirteen lessons will likely have been recorded, and postproduction will be underway. We have also adopted a new approach for our onscreen graphics. Instead of using Photoshop to generate graphics, we now use Keynote on the Mac to prepare slides in advance. These slides are recorded live alongside the video lesson during studio sessions. This method reduces postproduction time by up to 50%, enabling us to serve more efficiently.

Our two Zoom Bible study groups continue to thrive.

The first group, with participants from Taiwan, China, and Malaysia, has completed the study of *Galatians*. Our next course will be on the book of *Ephesians*. These same lessons will also be recorded for future use in the Chinese Bible School video curriculum.

The second group, with members from various parts of China, recently completed a study on Old Testament prophecies. They are now engaged in a new study titled “Lord, Teach Us to Pray.” In this course, we examine Jesus’ model prayer. Many participants, not being from the Lord’s church, initially believed this to be the “Lord’s Prayer” meant to be recited during assembly. I believe this study marked the first time they truly understood its context and meaning. I praise God for their open hearts and willingness to receive the truth.

Thank you, dear brethren, for your continued support, encouragement, and prayers. Your partnership in this mission is making a powerful and lasting impact, helping to spread the gospel among Chinese-speaking people around the world.

May God bless you abundantly in your faith, love, and service.
