We are delighted to announce the completion of both video recording and post-production for the series of lessons on the Book of *Galatians*. Thanks to a new approach—integrating on-screen graphics and live recording during studio sessions—the post-production timeline has been significantly reduced from one month to less than two weeks. In addition, we're excited to share that ten lesson manuscripts for the upcoming series on the Book of *Ephesians* have been completed. These materials are also being used in our weekly Zoom Bible study, which includes participants from Taiwan, China, and Malaysia. So far, the first four lessons—covering chapter one—have been deeply explored. Students have shown great appreciation for the rich teachings on the work of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, as well as Paul's first recorded prayer in the epistle. We are truly grateful for their hunger and thirst for God's Word and pray the Lord will richly bless their spiritual growth.

Our second Zoom Bible study group, composed of brethren from various regions of China, is currently engaged in the study titled "Lord, Teach Us to Pray." Along with Jesus' model prayer, we have examined examples from both the Old and New Testaments—learning how to pray without ceasing, how to intercede for others, and how to seek God in times of trouble. This study has not only enriched our understanding of prayer but also deepened the spiritual bond among the participants. Despite geographical distances and various challenges, the group gathers each week with eager hearts, often lingering long after the study ends to share insights, burdens, and prayers. As we look ahead to concluding this study early next month, we give thanks to God for how He is working through His Word to revive and strengthen the prayer lives of His people.

We thank you, dear brethren, for your continued prayers, generous support, and loving partnership in this ministry.
