MONTHLY REPORT—June 2023

We are thrilled to share with you the highlights of our recent mission trip to Malaysia and Taiwan in June. While we had scheduled speaking engagements, we also focused on meaningful visitations during our journey.

The gospel meetings at the Skudai church of Christ in Malaysia took place on the evenings of June 2-4. During the days, we had the privilege of visiting several non-Christians. Among them were a mother and son who had been engaged in a study of the book of Revelation with a "teacher" from Korea online. They were captivated by the concept of premillennialism and the intricate interpretations of the "signs" in Revelation. However, by presenting them with the truth from other books of the Bible, we were able to persuade them to delve deeper into their study by watching video lessons from the Chinese Bible School. We admire their open minds and sincerely pray that God blesses their hearts to accept the truth when they discover it.

A dedicated worker at the Skudai congregation, sister Kelly, excels at connecting with individuals interested in a Bible study. She arranged for us to visit with her former boss, who had previously managed a pig trading business, but was grappling with guilt associated with animal slaughter, being influenced by Buddhist teachings. It was a tremendous opportunity to introduce him to the God of the Bible and teach him about His allowances. After his conscience was enlightened by the Word of God, we spent an additional 30 minutes watching the Chinese video "Where Do We Go When We Die?" He honestly shared that he needed to weigh the cost before making a decision to embrace Christianity. We sincerely hope and pray for the day when he will embrace the faith.

During the Asian Chinese Bible Lectureship held in Kuala Lumpur on June 8-10, we distributed 15 military-grade hard drives containing Chinese videos to individuals, congregations, and institutions from China, Malaysia, Singapore, and Taiwan. The demand was overwhelming, requiring careful consideration of where the hard drives should be allocated. One hard drive was given to an individual from China whom I had never met. She and her husband have tirelessly spread the gospel of Christ for many decades, even enduring imprisonment. Her request was to receive a hard drive that she could duplicate and distribute to thousands of people in China. Her boldness in the face of persecution for the sake of Christ has been truly inspiring, motivating us to continue our efforts to spread the good news.

We express our heartfelt gratitude to brother Jerry and sister Tracy, who graciously accompanied us on a long journey from Hualian to Hengchun, Taiwan. After four years of separation, we were finally able to visit our dear sister-in-Christ. The fiveand-a-half-hour drive each way, along with the few hours we spent together, was absolutely worthwhile. She said, "Sister Yolanda, the hug you gave me when you were leaving the other day touched me to the core!...I have been away from God's embrace for so many years, and I have been through a lot of things! Thank you for not giving up on me! I know God has never given up on me either!" We pray that the love of God continues to envelop her and she will remain faithful to the Lord.
